Sammamish Comprehensive Plan Goals

The following is a summary of goals for each comprehensive plan element that apply to the 212th Avenue SE at Ebright Creek project. The full list of Comprehensive Plan Goals and Policies can be found <u>here</u>.

Land Use Goals (This project meets 9 of the 11 goals)

- Build community character and identity on a Citywide basis to enhance the high quality of family life established in Sammamish.
- Preserve and enhance the natural features, quality, character and function of the City's residential neighborhoods.
- Ensure that public facilities support and strengthen community character.
- Provide for planned population and employment growth and maintain the City's suburban patterns.
- Promote development design that maintains a harmonious relationship with the natural environment.
- Support a land use pattern that promotes community health and connectivity within and between neighborhoods and active transportation routes consistent with public safety needs.
- Encourage sustainable development.
- Identify, protect, encourage and preserve historic, cultural and archaeological resources.
- Establish a community that maintains and enhances the quality of life for everyone living and working within Sammamish.

Environment & Conservation Goals (This project meets 8 of the 10 goals)

- Serve as a leader in environmental stewardship of the natural environment for current and future generations.
- Protect people, property and the environment in areas of natural hazards.
- Protect wetlands and other water resources from encroachment and degradation and encourage restoration of such resources.
- Protect and promote a diversity of plant, pollinator and animal species habitat in Sammamish.
- Maintain and protect surface water and groundwater resources that serve the community and enhance the quality of life.
- Improve and preserve air quality.
- Sammamish is a sustainable city.
- Increase the sustainability and efficiency of building practices in Sammamish.

Transportation Goals (This project meets all four goals)

- Supporting Growth Support the city's and region's growth strategy by focusing on moving people and goods within the city and beyond with a highly efficient multimodal transportation network.
- Greater Options and Mobility Invest in transportation systems that offer greater options, mobility, and access in support of the city's growth strategy.
- Operations, Maintenance, Management and Safety As a high priority, maintain, preserve, and operate the city's transportation system in a safe and functional state.

• Sustainability - Design and manage the city's transportation system to minimize the negative impacts of transportation on the natural environment, to promote public health and safety, and to achieve optimum efficiency.

Utilities Goals (This project has potential to meet 3 of the 6 goals)

- Support coordination with service providers to minimize cost and service disruption.
- Encourage placement, siting and design of utilities to support community character and promote uninterrupted service.
- Facilitate citywide utility services that are consistent, reliable, equitable, competitive, and financially sustainable.

Capital Facilities Goals (This project meets all five goals)

- Provide capital facilities and public services necessary to support existing and new development envisioned in the land use element.
- Provide adequate capital facilities that address past deficiencies, meet the needs of growth and annexations and enhance the quality of life through acceptable levels of service.
- Strive for financially feasible planned capital facilities.
- Design and locate capital facilities with features and characteristics that support the environment, energy efficiency, aesthetics, technological innovation, cost- effectiveness, and sustainability.
- Maintain capital facilities so that they are reliable, functional, safe, sanitary, clean, attractive, efficient, and financially sustainable.
